- 3.ClearLeaf successively raised US\$500,000 in Seed Money in an extremely challenging year.

"As a new challenging year begins, ClearLeaf is currently in discussions with several of the largest agrochemical distributors in Costa Rica for both organic and conventional markets. In Colombia and Ecuador, two countries that are critically important for scaling, we are well-advanced in the registration process, for multiple crops. We are also in the final stage of releasing new products for soil protection and in vitro propagation. 2021 will be the breakout year for the company in terms of commercial sales, and we are investing in it, hiring technical sales specialists in each major market."
